Neighbors Link works to **build stronger communities** through **immigrant empowerment and integration.**

During this time when the basic human rights of immigrants are under threat, Neighbors Link has stepped up our work. We are providing expanded legal assistance, community education, access to community resources, and advocacy. We are prepared to meet this moment with our mission to serve and uplift those who call this community home.

2025 BY THE NUMBERS



882 volunteers donated over **17,807 HOURS** TO MAKE OUR WORK **POSSIBLE**, a 20% increase in hours over last year.



CAREERS AND PATHWAYS

Careers and Pathways reached **1,028 people** with digital literacy classes, workforce development programs, workshops, and individual assistance for job seekers, a **9% increase** over last year.



Neighbors Link Community Law Practice served **2,894 unique clients** through consultations, screenings and cases. This includes **2,543 cases**, with an 84% success rate. The amount of staff time required for each case has risen significantly in the past year due to policy changes from the federal government.



MORE THAN 1,700 ENGLISH LANGUAGE LEARNERS took part in virtual or in-person classes.



MORE THAN 1,650 PARENTS AND CHILDREN attended in-person Family Center programming.



FAMILY & INDIVIDUAL SUPPORT SERVICES were provided to **1,122 unique clients** on matters including transportation assistance, diaper distribution, referrals to emergency housing shelters, medical, mental health, and legal services.



Neighbors Link reached over **11,000 community members** with educational trainings on topics such as immigration policy updates, constitutional rights, advocacy, cultural awareness, legal information, as well as clinics and round table events.

NEIGHBORS LINK PROGRAMS

Neighbors Link's programs include English language education, legal services and advocacy, career development, digital literacy, a Worker Center, workforce training, community engagement, parent education, early childhood programs, and academic support for school-age children of immigrants. Key to Neighbors Link's work is creating a shared forum for engagement between new Americans and longer-term residents through volunteerism, cultural awareness training, and civic advocacy.



NEIGHBORS LINK COMMUNITY LAW PRACTICE

provides a full array of free immigration legal services, including deportation defense, naturalization, Temporary Protected Status, asylum, family reunification, DACA, and Special Immigrant Juvenile Status cases.



THE FAMILY CENTER

supports parents raising bilingual, bicultural children to succeed in school and beyond. Programming includes parent education, early childhood development, academic support for students, and partnerships to link families to community resources.



THE WORKER CENTER

facilitates connections to employment, advocacy for fair wages, and workforce development training to help people move toward economic stability.



ADVOCACY OPPORTUNITIES

allow community members to come together to fight for policies that recognize the dignity and value of each person.



CAREERS AND PATHWAYS

offers workforce training programs in high-demand fields, support for entrepreneurship, a business center for community use, individual career guidance, and a large number of digital literacy classes for adults. The overall goal is to support immigrants, regardless of citizenship status, to pursue their work and career goals for economic mobility.



ENGLISH FOR SPEAKERS OF OTHER LANGUAGES (ESOL)

programs support full integration for immigrants in our community. All ESOL levels are taught in person and online at Neighbors Link.



COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

programs address issues related to knowing your rights when interacting with immigration or law enforcement, important updates on immigration policy, and encouraging meaningful dialogue throughout the entire community.



FAMILY & INDIVIDUAL SUPPORT SERVICES

are provided on medical issues, employment, food insecurity, and other issues through an extensive network of partnerships. Neighbors Link works closely with immigrant families across Westchester County to help them navigate complex systems, stabilize during times of crisis, and access essential internal and external community resources.



VOLUNTEER PROGRAMS bring diverse communities together and inspire a culture of integration and collaboration among residents.



IMMIGRATION RESOURCES

are available in English and Spanish on our website. These resources include critical immigration updates, virtual community education, and guidance for community groups.
